THE ASCENSION

Many Christian churches will celebrate Ascension Day on May 21, which is 40 days after Easter. Theologian Friedemann Hebart explained Christ's Ascension this way:

"When Jesus' work on Earth was done, he took leave of his disciples and went to be with his Father. A time for sad farewells, one might think. Yet, the church celebrates the Ascension with special joy. What is the reason for joy when Jesus leaves his people?

"The Ascension is not the end of Jesus' work, but a new beginning! How could Jesus ever leave us alone? Because he has gone to be Lord of the universe, he can continue his work of life and love - among us, too. His work was not just a short episode in Galilee. In the person of the Holy Spirit, the same Lord is present among us, still revealing the Father's loving heart, so that we, too, can believe - and sing songs of joy."



PENTECOST SUNDAY

On May 31, Christians around the world will celebrate the Day of Pentecost. It's often remembered as the church's birthday. Before Jesus ascended into heaven, he promised that the Holy Spirit would come upon those who believed in his resurrection.

Three thousand people were gathered in Jerusalem when the Spirit came upon them. They were so touched by the Holy Spirit that they began to worship regularly, especially on Sundays, the day of Christ's resurrection.

To symbolize the "tongues, as of fire" (Acts 2:3, NRSV) that came upon the people present at Pentecost, liturgical churches display the color red in their worship services on Pentecost Sunday. Many people attending worship wear red on that day.



MEMORIAL DAY

Over the years, Memorial Day has become a big holiday weekend. It's now the unofficial start of summer, rather than a day of tribute to the departed it was originally meant to be.

Even if we plan fun events for Memorial Day weekend, it's important to stop long enough to bow our heads and pay respect to our departed loved ones - especially those who fell in battle while helping preserve America's liberties.

Let us take time to make the pilgrimage to various cemeteries and pause long enough to say, "Thank you, Father, for these special lives, for sacrifices made and for friendships we have shared.

SESSION NOTES HIGHLIGHTS

The Session met on Wednesday, April 22nd at 9:30 in our Fellowship Hall with Parish Associate Ken McCullen and COM representative, Elder Leon Bennett. All session members were present except for Geri Bintliff who was excused, being out of state.

Session discussed many items including the welcome of five new members: Fred and Peggy Lynn by certificate of transfer, Cleo Ahlstedt from Affiliate to Active, Donna Den Bleyker from inactive to Active, Lucille Kraehling by Reaffirmation.

Among items discussed were the appointment of a committee to consider the extension of Pastor Bill's Interim status: the remodeling of our "kitchen;" the putting in of a walkway from the parking lot to the Fellowship Hall and to the Sanctuary; work needed on our windows; and outreach to the neighborhood and community; the hiring of a gardener to care for our property' and the hiring of Daniel Morgan to do custodial work before and after worship, weddings, etc. Approved vacation dates and pulpit supplies while Pastor Bill and Joyce are away on trips; called a congregation meeting for May 3rd, 2009, immediately following worship to elect four members to the All Church Nominating Committee.

Session reminded themselves, and all of us, that they welcome and desire to have lots of ideas and thoughts concerning our new church, but that *all actions* for any work, additions, or changes, are approved by Session before anything happens.

The meeting of Session adjourned with prayer to meet again on Wednesday, May 27th at 9:30 am.

From Gail Jones' Kitchen

NEW ORLEANS CAKE

3/4 tsp. nutmeg
1 tsp. cinnamon
2 tbs. cocoa
3/4 c buttermilk
1 tsp. vanilla
1 tsp. lemon extract
1/2 c chopped nuts

Cream shortening, add sugar gradually and eggs together. Sift flour, baking powder, soda, salt and spices and cocoa together. Add creamed mixture alternately with sour milk. Blend in extracts and nuts (which have been toasted). Bake in 2 greased and floured 8" pans (layer) for 30 minutes in 350 degree oven.

MOCHA ICING

(For New Orleans Cake)

6 tbs. butter 11/2 tbs. cocoa 1 egg yolk 1 tsp. cinnamon

3 c powdered sugar 11/2 to 3 tbs. hot coffee

Cream butter, blend in egg yolk. Sift sugar, cocoa and cinnamon together and add to creamed mixture alternately with hot coffee. Beat until smooth. (If necessary, add few more drops of coffee until icing spreads easily).
