From Pastor Bill's "Powerbook"



Can anything Stop us if we are following God's guidance for us? Absolutely Not!

I see so much energy, so much excitement, so many good things happening at PSPC in our new church that I am excited and energized as well - and I probably talk and write too much, but that is because of my excitement and thankfulness for what is already happening here in anticipation of what will happen, and for the privilege and blessing of being your interim pastor and getting to know and love all of you - permanent residents and winter residents alike and new guests!

As we move into our long-hot desert summer days many plans are being made for the Fall/Winter/Spring of this coming year from remodeling the kitchen to making the Chancel (stage) more viable for our use to plans for Sunday School for kids to a Vacation Bible School for next summer and on and on. In my mind there are four keys for making this coming year, and the following ones, a success:

1. **Prayer.** Constant prayer. Pray without ceasing for God's guidance in the decisions that are and will be made. Unless we listen to God as he guides us we will fall flat on our faces; if we listen and obey then we will see "success" beyond our wildest dreams. So, please covenant with me, whether you live here year - round or are Winter Residents (aka Snow Birds) to join us in daily prayer for the future of Palm Springs Presbyterian Church. God has given us a great opportunity. Remember: in Chinese the character for "opportunity" is the same "danger." Good things for God and God's creation (our neighbors) seldom happen without some risks. Not living in the past, but moving into God's future.

2. **Participation.** *Time and Talents.* You and I are needed, along with others, to jump in with both feet as well as hearts and minds, to get the job done. We need people willing to serve on Session Committees, Deacon Committees, Mission Committees, as Sunday School teachers, choir members (isn't it great the see the choir [Praise Singers] growing?), websites helpers, community involvement, visitors, bakers and bread makers, as well as people willing to fold the Order for Worship for Sundays and other mailings and materials or vacuum or rake leaves or paint or pour cement or lay bricks or ...

3. **Support.** *Treasures.* We are still in an economic downturn, oh boy, are we! And a number of us are on fixed or somewhat fixed incomes; some of our financial portfolios have declined and we are more carefully counting our pennies than we have for a long time; Joyce and I are also. But, your church continues and it continues to need your financial support. *Otherwise the doors will close and we will loose this beautiful property!* Neither our Lord nor we want that to ever happen, do we? We will be having a Stewardship program this fall and it is my prayer that every one of us will prayerfully consider <u>increasing</u> our pledging/tithing to Palm Springs Presbyterian Church. If you are a Snow Bird, you can pledge just by dividing your pledge by the time spent in each place.

Even right how we can return to God a little bit extra either for the general operating budget or the building fund or for special needs or all three!

4. Listening. Listening to each other and valuing all thoughts, ideas, questions, and

suggestions. *There is no such thing as a bad suggestion or question.* God listens to us; do we listen to each other? I believe so, but I also believe that more of us need to speak and all of us need to listen. We need to share our hearts and minds in love and acceptance and then allow the Holy Spirit to guide the Session in making decisions.

We are putting together a "**Wish List**" of needs for our church....a partial one is included elsewhere in this issue of the Sonshine. It is my hope that you will pick out one (or a part of one) of the items and give over and above your annual pledge and/or your pledge to "*A Place of Our Own*"

I am absolutely convinced that God is at work in our midst and has plans for us beyond our dreams or expectations. But, unless we are committed to obeying God's voice and supporting in so many ways the outreach, the mission, the fellowship, the worship of our church, then it just might not happen. None of us want that to happen, do we?

As I said last month, how about working with Ken McCullen on visiting the people of our neighborhood with information about our church - teams of two or three and not trying to convert anyone? How about greeting visitors with a welcoming bag of goodies like cookies or a cake or a small loaf of bread to be given to first time guests during worship? Anyone willing to bake those? How about visiting first time visitors the week immediately following their first visit? I always write them but they are really impressed when it comes from you! I am expected to write or call or do something, but you...wow! That would make a difference! Just let me know or let one of the Session members know!

Need I say more? Quite frankly I am excited about the possibilities and opportunities facing us, but I also recognize the dangers and risks if we behave like most Protestants and Presbyterians. Leaving it up to someone else to do it.

Now, I must add: I am so delighted and impressed by the number of you who literally go the extra mile in working and in returning to God of God's blessings (giving financially, time-wise, and talent wise) in our church helping make "things" happen. You are not only appreciated, but also blessed of God and I give God three cheers for you! But, more could be added to that list!

May God bless PSPC as God leads us into a potentially exciting future for the Glory of God in the Name of Jesus and by the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Thank you all for what you are already doing and for what you will be doing!

SESSION NOTES HIGHLIGHTS

The Session met on Wednesday, June 18th at 9:30 in our Fellowship Hall with Moderator Pastor Bill Johnson and COM representative Leon Bennett. All session members were present except for Bob Wulf who is out of state and Fran Gotenstein who was ill: both excused.

Session began with Pastor Bill reading from the Psalms as Session members meditated in prayer. Session opened with prayer. Session approved all minutes from the June meeting.

- Session received a communiqué from Presbytery regarding a Gathering in the Neighborhood Conference in August at the Solano Beach Presbyterian Church and is looking for 3 to 4 or more volunteers to attend: August 21st & 22nd. Session also received a request from the former Unity Church of Palm Springs to rent space from us; the moderator appointed a committee to look into this possibility.
- Session has now received three bids/plans for remodeling the kitchen and the chancel and will decide soon on which bid will be awarded the contract. Work should be completed before the end of summer.
- Session received a review of a new website proposal from Alex Danson which would include audio availability of Sunday service and would store those services for an indefinite period of time. No decision has yet been made; Session also discussed the need and cost of PowerPoint for our church and is looking into options.
- Session discussed proposals for a Wedding brochure to be made available to potential wedding couples; this is in process including prices.
- Pastor Bill noted that for the amount of time which we are spending discussing and deciding on the building we might consider two meetings a month: one for the building only and the other for our

regular session business.

• Session heard reports from all committees and approved all reports.

Session adjourned with prayer at 11:40 a.m. to meet either on July 16th and/or on call.

Greetings from Oregon~~~

I write to send a thank you from my son, John, and me for all the prayers and concern offered by members of PSPC as we traversed the difficult years of our wife and daughter-in-law's battle with cancer. Georgia's spiritual strength was an inspiration to all of us who knew her. On May 30, she willingly transitioned from her painful earthly home to the peaceful loving arms of our Lord.

She and John spent a week in Palm Springs in April and were so pleased to meet many of the PSPC prayer warriors who helped to sustain her during her seven year battle. She was grateful to receive our weekly blue prayer sheet showing her name. That was not an insignificant list in her mind, as she knew the value of intercessory prayers.

Additionally, I thank all of you who sent me e-mails, notes or phoned after my eye surgeries (in Denver, CO.) Living in a hotel room for a week helped me comply with the post-op instructions of doing nothing...with a capital "N." On my last check up, I was released to do "normal activities," except "move furniture." The surgery was a success and, hopefully, will control my low pressure glaucoma.

With all the support and prayers you provided for my family and me, is it any wonder on June 5, that I was too embarrassed to tell my friends at PSPC that I was again having serious conversations with the Lord due to a broken ankle? Playing catch-up with homeowner's tasks, after an unusual heavy rain storm meant cleaning much debris from the gutters from a big step ladder, something I've done often. But, this time cleaning was more extensive and the stepladder and I parted company when one leg bent after sinking into a concrete crawl space wall. I was hanging onto the gutter, and only dropped a few feet to the ground, but, unfortunately, I rolled my foot, which broke the tip off the tibia (shin bone) in the ankle. After finishing my work, I drove myself to the ER and that was the beginning of what seems to me to be "much to do about nothing." The orthopedic surgeon assures me this is not the case and a screw was necessary for a good bond if I wanted a stable ankle for the rest of my life. So, one surgery, now one big walking boot and three weeks later, I am still restricted from walking on my right foot...for another two weeks. Not only am I practicing my "patience," I am learning innovative ways to accomplish both necessary tasks and a few things, just to see if I can do it. The walker and the wheel chair wear me out and putting together the handy power scooter, kept in the trunk of my car, takes a minor engineering degree and a little strength, but I count my blessing to have such equipment available and loving family and friends to have stayed with me, helped me and laughed with me. (I'm a floor dweller...it's often easier.)

I'll use every form of mobility this weekend when the extended family has their annual camping outing. One more challenge and more creativity, but I'll master it somehow...maybe, with the help (?) and distraction of several little "go-fers," (grandchildren.)

An added note of interest regarding my activity, as a member of the National Response Team for the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, I was deployed to the Santa Barbara fires two days after making the seasonal move back to Oregon and prior to the eye surgery. A teammate and I were in contact with Executive Presbyter Jan Armstrong and churches in the area. We thank God that the worst case scenario did not come to past and the fire crews saved the city from what was feared to be a catastrophic event.

Again, thank you for the thoughtful well wished sent my way. It is exciting to hear what is going on at PSPC. We are blessed to have so many dedicated people attending PSPC, generous supporters in the wings, and talented individuals working on all the needs of the church - Thank you. I look forward to my return this fall and again being part of "the little church that could."

The following is an excerpt from a letter dated 12-21-05 from Dr. Barbara Nagy who is a doctor at a hospital in Malawi. "Dear Friends, Greetings from Malawi and joy and peace to you. We are getting lots and lots of rain, fields have been planted, and people are once again giving thanks for the start of another growing season. While the severe famine from last year will continue at least another three months, we have received gifts from many corners to help, and for the time being we have some food aid available. In particular, the orphan project and poor people from all of our congregations are receiving emergency food from the 2-Cents-a-Meal program, and the hospital has funds for feeding the many malnourished children on the children's ward. We are extremely grateful for this support, and are seeing daily, it's impact on the hungry around us. Children are admitted with severe edema from malnutrition, and as they get adequate food we see the "real children' emerge like butterflies from cocoons, able to sit up, smile, and play again. Still over 50 percent of the children's ward admissions suffer from acute or chronic malnutrition, and I will not feel satisfied until we have attacked this problem more at its root causes, a very long-term task.

AMERICA

Samuel Francis Smith, a Baptist pastor, wrote the hymn "America" in 1831. Smith was studying a tune he had never heard, although he knew the British used it for the hymn "God Save the King." The British had borrowed the tune from the Germans, who gave it patriotic lyrics. Smith described what happened as he contemplated the tune: "I instantly felt the impulse to write a patriotic hymn of my own, adapted to the tune. Picking up a scrap of waste paper which lay near me, I wrote at once, probably within half an hour, the hymn "America," as it is now known everywhere."

Smith's friend and classmate Oliver Wendell Holmes once told him, "Your name and fame will live when I and my works are forgotten."


CALLING ALL MEN Wednesday @ 7:00 AM

Black Bean Salsa

- 1 tbs. cumin
- 3 tbs. honey

Add:

3 cans black beans, rinsed and drained 2 cans diced tomatoes *w/flavoring of choice 1 1/2 c canned or frozen (thawed) white corn 1 green pepper, chopped 1 sweet onion, chopped Garnish with parsley

You can add whatever inspires you: avocado, cilantro. The key is the cumin with whatever *"flavoring of choice" you use. It can be different every time!
