Pastor Bill's "April Antics."



"For I am absolutely convinced (that nothing at all) will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." Romans 8:38-39 abridged nrsv

Certainly as we enter more fully into Lent, preparing for Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, and Easter, this verse stands out as one that has upheld my life over the years. What about you and your faith in Christ Jesus? This is as good a time as any to re-evaluate your walk with Christ and your confidence in him.

What's going on? You have just elected a wonderful, gifted pastor, the Rev. Christine Dickerson, who begins her ministry here on May 1st. During April, because Joyce and I are sneaking away for a brief Caribbean Cruise from March 30 to April 11, you will be blessed by having the Rev. Dr. Charles Hammond, former Moderator of the General Assembly of the PC(USA) preach and administer Communion on April 3rd, and then on April 10 you will be privileged to have Elder Suzanne Swartz leading us in worship. (While we are gone there will be pastoral friends available in emergencies; Jackie will know who they are.) Joyce and I return late on the 11th and I will be leading worship on *Palm Sunday* with a sermon I call, **"Who In the World Do You Think Jesus Is?"** and then on *Maundy Thursday* we will have dinner at 6:00 p.m. and then Communion and the Tenebrae at 7:00 p.m. with our Praise Choir and Celebration Band singing "????" My Communion Meditation is, **"You Are Chosen"** Then on what I prefer to call *"Resurrection Sunday,"* aka *Easter*, we will celebrate Jesus' resurrection; my sermon is called, **"Christ is Risen! No If's, And's, or But's!"**

But allow me to add this: with the terrible earthquake and tsunami hitting Japan a short time ago, this is another opportunity for us to reach out in the name of Christ to help those hurting so terribly. For me, giving through our **Presbyterian Disaster Assistance** ministry is the best way to help. If you are able and so desire send checks to PSPC noting either Japan or **PDA** and we will forward them asap; Joyce and I have already done so.

Also, during April, especially on Palm Sunday and Easter, Presbyterian Churches receive the **One Great Hour of Sharing Offering.** You will be reading about the **OGHS** and will receive a letter from me about the OGHS. Please respond generously and graciously, as you always do, to this opportunity and privilege to help others in Christ's name. Joyce and I certainly will! Remember: PSPC is almost always one of the most generous of churches in our Presbytery, per capita, in responding to these special ways to help. Let's keep that record going.

Joyce and I will miss all of you for you are deeply loved by both of us. In these nearly six years (*I never thought in my wildest dreams we would be here this long!*) I've served as your Interim Pastor your love, enthusiasm and energy, your commitment to Christ and to Mission, has been and is infectious. The laughs and tears we've shared will never be forgotten; your excitement in obtaining this lovely building; your cooperation in remodeling and getting the PowerPoint is beyond imagination; the "joyful noise" of the Praise Choir and the Celebration Band under the guidance of Alex Danson is an example for all; the faithful ministry of Jackie Morgan and Jim DeHart on an everyday basis is something every pastor longs for as is the PowerPoint running by Jeff Morgan and Daniel Morgan and a few others who are learning the "tricks of the trade."

Easter's Meaning

In a 2010 Barna Group survey, two-thirds of Americans knew that Easter is a religious holiday. But only 42 percent connected its meaning to Jesus' resurrection. And only two percent of adults said they would describe Easter as the most important holiday of their faith.

Not everyone who connects Easter to religion has the facts straight. Two percent of Americans said Easter is about Jesus' birth. Another two percent said it's about Jesus' "rebirth." And one percent said it's a celebration of his second coming. Another three percent described Easter as a celebration of spring or a pagan holiday.

In the same survey, 31 percent of active churchgoers said they'd definitely invite an unchurched friend to worship with them on Easter weekend.

This Easter, share the truth and joy of the holiday with someone who doesn't know Jesus. News of the resurrection is too good to keep to ourselves! 2

A THOUGHTFUL ACTION FOR TODAY A Ministry Funding For Tomorrow

A number of churches with which I am familiar have encouraged members to "plan ahead!" for future ministry. For example: in one of them a member who is in her 70s has a paid-up insurance policy with a cash value of \$50,000.00. She does not need this to protect or support her family; she has changed the beneficiary to her church which also gives her a tax deduction for the cash value of this gift. It is payable to her church upon her death.

In another church a member in his 50s wants to help in outreach and mission and has purchased in the church's name a whole life policy worth \$100,000.00 payable to the church upon his death. It, too, is tax deductible.

Gifts like this are popular and easy and a good way to help support the future of your church. Have you done this or even thought about this? If you are interested please speak to either Elder Jim DeHart (Clerk of Session) or to Pastor Bill both of whom can give you more information. Bibs or Aprons? Which Are You?

Bibs are for people who only want to be fed. Bibs are for those who are not yet ready or willing to feed themselves.

Bibs are for those who are more interested in being served than in serving.

Bibs are for those who insist that the church exists for them and their needs.

Bibs are for babes in the faith, those who haven't caught God's vision for the church, or those who are not yet of the faith.

Aprons are for those who have a heart to serve others in Jesus' name.

Aprons are for those who know that they are the church.

Aprons are for those who don't mind getting their hands dirty.

Aprons are for those who take the time daily to feed their spiritual hunger.

Aprons are for those who are growing in faith, and hunger to help others grow.

Church growth consultant, Win Arn, interviewed thousands of Christians in America several years ago and asked them, what they thought the church existed for. Eighty-eight percent said, "The church exists to serve my needs and the needs of my family." In other words, 88% of Christians in America are still wearing bibs.

On the night when he was betrayed, just hours before he was crucified, the very Son of God took off his outer garments, wrapped a towel around his waist, and washed his disciples' feet. When he was done he said, "I have just given you an example to follow." In other words, Jesus called his disciples to wear aprons, not bibs.



Session Notes Highlights

The Session met on Wednesday, March 16, 2011 at 9:40a.m. Session convened with prayer, many Session members bringing before us people and events about whom we prayed, trusting in the comforting and healing presence of our Lord. Pastor Bill lead us in a devotional on loving our neighbors as Jesus commanded, reminding us that when anyone in the church says *"we always do something this way"* or *"we never do it that way"* is not a loving message and is destructive to God's work; we then opened with prayer. All Session members were present with Elders Harry Henderson and Sue Cooper being excused. Our guest was Elder Anne Smith from the Committee on Ministry of Presbytery.

Much business was conducted including approving communion by intinction on Maundy Thursday, the development of a Grant Seeking Committee with Ernie Moore and Bob Wulf heading the committee, the design and development of a Celtic Cross to go on the top of the church under the guidance of Ernie Moore, the approval of the terms of call for the Rev. Christine Dickerson, encouraging all members of the Session and inviting members of the congregation to attend the Presbytery meeting on March 26th when Christine Dickerson is present to and received by our Presbytery. Session also approved the income budget for 2011 with appreciation for the increase in pledges for 2011 - about a \$21,000 increase over 2010! We expressed disappointment with the poor turnout for the Disaster Preparedness seminary held March 12th but were confident that those who attended were helped.

Session was reminded by several members that it is imperative that we continue the *"transparency"* we practice so that, except in Personnel Matters, all that we do is open to the congregation as we do now.

Session adjourned about 11:15a.m. with prayer and with Pastor Bill expressing deep appreciation to the Session for their commitment and hard work ~~ he would not trade the session of PSPC for any other! Pastor Bill also reminded the Session that once he was gone, he and Joyce are gone, and he will deeply miss the people of PSPC but this is the way the Presbyterian Church works. The next Session meeting is Wednesday, April 20th at 9:30 a.m. in the Social Hall of the church if needed.

From Kay Chabot's Kitchen Souper Bowl Recipe

Vegetable Beef Barley Soup

1 1/2 lb. stew meat or round steak, fat trimmed, and cut in bite size pieces

7 1/2 c water

- 2 cans (14-15 oz) diced tomatoes in juice
- 1/2 c chopped onion
- 1 1/2 tbsp. salt (do not omit-need it)
- 1 tbsp. Worcestershire
- 1 tsp. pepper
- 1/4 tsp. chili pepper
- 3 bay leaves
- 1 1/2 c sliced celery
- 1 1/2 c sliced carrots
- 1 1/2 c diced potatoes
- 2 to 3 c shredded cabbage-I use 3! (the package slaw is fine) 3/4 c barley

Put all ingredients in a 6 qt slow cooker or large kettle on top of stove. Bring to boil, then simmer for 4 hours on stove top. In a slow cooker, I start on high for an hour then turn to low for about 5-6 hours. I actually prefer this on top of stove as it doesn't get as "mushy." If you like a thicker soup, you may increase barley. It freezes beautifully!
