"Surely I spoke of things I did not understand, things too wonderful for me to know." (Job 42:3b)

From Pastor Christine,



It's amazing what can happen when one opens a Bible at random and chooses to read the first verse that catches the eye: Job – who would have thought! And yet, it perfectly reflects our reactions, as Christians, to the world around us, and certainly to a world that is always in transition.

"You've been here a year now,' I can hear the voices saying, 'so what do you mean, in transition?' "We are always in transition, or should be, since we exist in the living and always revealing Word of God. That's how Job's comment connects to our lives, as we continue forward, listening for the presence of the Spirit – and often missing what God has placed before us.

Most folks like familiarity; it grounds us, and allows us to flow through circumstances with less stress. We have been known to expect familiarity, particularly in our 'safe' places, like Worship and church structure. It can be disarming when someone new comes along, and we wonder if we will lose that 'safe place.' I hope by now everyone knows that, even with transitions, gradual revisiting of familiar traditions and new faces joining our church family, PSPC is still the safe place, the joyful place, where we gather as one in Christ.

And yet.....this is a seminal time. A season has passed, another begins. Opportunity presents itself, as I challenged your Session (now called 'Council' in the New Form OF Government), to be bold! How can we imagine new ways to reach out, to welcome in, to serve? Let's encourage one another, in this imagining! We can remember Job, as he reflected on his reluctance to embrace God's expression over a faith he had been confident in, and his revelation of God's wisdom, foresight and plan; in his caution we might recognize our own reluctance, and in his understanding, our own possibilities to experience, as revealed by our Creator, 'things too wonderful' as Christ's people in Palm Springs.

As your Pastor, I will dream with you and serve with and for you. To my time spent making calls, visits, preparing for Worship, study, serving on Presbytery committees, meeting with other Pastors, attending City events, I hope to add increased participation in civic affairs and, working with our Outreach and Evangelism teams, exploring creative ways to make our Beloved Community a *living* voice that more will want to not just experience, but share in the *expression* of Christ's love through outreach and mission.

As you can see, it was not Job's suffering and being tested that jumped from that passage, but Job's rediscovery of his faith and purpose, and his claim as beloved by God. It's about his blessing and his refreshment, and his understanding that we humans, try as we may, can't obscure God's counsel. We listen, and we hear, and we respond. And things too wonderful will begin to unfold in our midst.

What will we hear, when we quiet our hearts and let the mighty splendor of the Holy, lead us?

Session met on Wednesday, April 19, 2012 at 9:35 a.m. Elder Frances Gotenstein read spiritually excerpts from "Words that Matter – Everyday Truths Guide and Inspire Change "followed with prayer. All members were present with Nancy Spencer & Bob Wulf being excused. Also present were Anne Smith," representing the Committee of Ministry (COM).

Session approved Elders Susan McGuire & Ernie Moore with Pastor Christine to create a sexual abuse policy in conjunction with the Presbytery of Riverside's Sexual Misuse Response Team for the next meeting. Session approved leave for Pastor Christine for April 27th thru May 6th. Session approved a tentative new member class for May 20th. Session approved purchasing a new computer for Jackie & updated accounting software of which funds were donated by an Elder for the computer and Women's Retreat for the software. Mission Committee reported that \$220 (20 kits) was received for the Presbyterian Disaster Program and \$812.30 for the One Great Hour of Sharing. The next 5:59 Gathering will be May 17th. Great ideas for outreach and evangelism were reviewed and Pastor Christine charged everyone to

think of our roles and be bold in ideas to be discussed at the next meeting.

The Treasurer's report showed a profit for the month of March of \$117 and a profit year to date as of March 31st of \$3,306. Session approved looking into companies and cost for accepting credit cards at our website.

Session was adjourned at 11:48 AM with prayer. The next Session will be on May 16th at 9:30 AM.

You generously gave \$812.30 to OGHS this year. Thanks to all.




Sonshine Deadline – May 21, 2012 Editor's Note
