Whenever change comes along in life, this passage from Ecclesiastes comes in pretty handy. And we know that change is both inevitable and necessary. Often it is difficult and we must forge onward (with God's help and love) until we reach a place of personal renewal; but more often it's good, positive, and leads us into new and wonderful things! And so it may be for us at Palm Springs Presbyterian, during the hot and somewhat lazy days of summer - a time to take advantage to make incremental changes that will lead us forward.



It's amazing to realize that I've been here for five years now, and in that time while much has remained the same, much has changed. Still, there is a lot to do, and your Session is working towards goals of fundraising and financial stability, new ways we might engage one another and our community, how to approach the much needed 'painting project,' and ways in which we can better utilize the limited space we have for our ministries. In the morning, the first here will unlock the lot gates, and visitors will park and enter there. On Sundays, we'll open the emergency exit for the band, much as we do now. It's been fun being so present and in the middle of things for the past five years, but many tasks have been impaired as well. I will continue to be accessible and now will be able to broaden what I do while present on site!

Both Jackie and I are discovering how much 'stuff' we have acquired, and are 'cleaning the closets' of our professional lives. In this way, we will make room for new possibilities, ideas, connections, communication and ways of being in our service to all of you. Working on this transition has inspired me to go through the 'stuff' I've acquired at home, too; and, to go through the 'stuff' on my mind and heart, those things that clutter the mind and stall opportunities for personal transformation. As God's people, we are called to be active and present in faith and service, looking beyond the earthly things and habits that can hold us back and cause the best of intentions to disappear, to fall aside.

Perhaps in this season, then, in these 'hot and lazy' days of summer, each of us can take the time to clear away the clutter that can stall us in shadow, and make room for the transforming love of God in our lives. We always talk about 'faith' being a verb, what if we thought of <u>ourselves</u> as being a verb?! Ready to be modified and put into action! There is a time for everything, for every activity under heaven, and what a joyful thought that we are motion,

"Out of Chaos..... HOPE"

As the motto of Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, the work of the National Response Team continues at an intense pace in this broken and hurting world. And, as representatives of the members and friends of Presbyterian Church USA, the team responds with your encouragement, concerns, and prayers to the survivors when responding to Natural, Technological, or Human Causes. Natural disasters recently in our area have been the wildfires (San Diego, Kern County, and San Francisco). Additionally, teams have responded to the Flint, MI public water crisis. The devastating flooding in West Virginia, Louisiana, and other areas will require long term recovery teams to assist in developing the community's plan for rebuilding. And, too often, we wake up to news of another human caused disaster devastating a community. At the request of the Presbytery of the area, PDA Teams respond quickly, to walk along-side the church (and community) leaders as they traverse uncharted waters of a human caused disaster, e.g. San Bernardino, CA, Charlestown, SC, Roseburg, OR, and Orlando, Fl. But, there is also joy in the morning when the response is to celebrate the

recovered in our Presbyterian community, such as the open house of "Westport Rising" Kansas City, Mo., after a major church fire. This is a sampling of the involvement of your Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. For each major disaster, a special fund is established and a Disaster Recovery Number assigned. At any time, gifts can be made through the church (the annual total mission gifts of each church are tracked) and you can be confident the funds benefit the survivors. Identify it as a PDA gift and, if it is for a specific disaster, please note so it will be appropriately credited.

On a personal note, thank you for your prayers, support and your interest in the work of PDA. It is a privilege to serve Christ and share his love, as part of the Mission Agency of Presbyterian Church, USA.
