Pastor Bill's "October-fest"

(Ps. 139:1-6 nrsv)



October is a **"festive"** time and leads us up to some of the most wonderful times in the Church year: Advent and Christmas. As **"festive"** as this fall and winter will be, what a wonderful time Joyce and I had on the east coast with our two oldest grandkids, Kallie, age 16 and Caleb, age 15! And we thank you for the time we had as we re-visited our American heritage from Williamsburg to Gettysburg and everything in between. If I tried to tell you even a fraction of what we saw and did you would throw this issue of the **Sonshine** away and call me a doting old grandfather for sharing every detail. So, I won't but you will hear snippets here and there, obviously.

Seeing all the beauty and history of our heritage as Americans reminded me so clearly of our heritage as brothers and sisters of Jesus. In II Timothy 2 Paul writes to Timothy,

"You then, my child, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus"

and those are words so applicable to us today; hopefully they can become our "by-word" for this fall and winter as we worship, study, pray, fellowship, serve others as well as our selves, and grow in the "grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ."

A recent study indicated that we, as Evangelicals and as Mainline Protestants, have a strong faith but are basically unable to explain or define our faith or theology or the Bible especially in contrast to Muslims and Jews. I hope and pray that we at Palm Springs Presbyterian Church will be...

First, "strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus;" and

Second, will be committed to knowing what and why we believe; and

Third. that we will be able to share our faith with others; and

Fourth, that we will make a point of sharing that faith.

It is my prayer, hope and goal for this coming year that all of us at PSPC make a commitment to study the Bible more, to pray more, to learn more about what and why we believe so that we can share this belief with others welcoming them into fellowship with us and with our Lord Jesus.

On Sundays I will be aiming in my sermons to help us understand what the Bible and our Reformed theology teaches about God and God's loving grace in Jesus Christ and how we can communicate that Good News to those around us. Basically, I will be using the Lectionary for the selection of Scriptures for Preaching and, as I do, I will be letting you know ahead of time the Scriptures and general directions of those sermons. I hope and pray that you will prayerfully and thoughtfully read and study those Scriptures before I preach on them!

For the "5:59 Gathering" on Thursdays, I will be leading us in a series on the historic Creeds and Confessions of the church and what they mean for us today and, hopefully, how we can communicate that with others around us.

We have now been in this beautiful little church for over 1 1/2 years; what are you and I doing to help it grow and be an effective force in this community?

Have you noticed on Hwy 111 the large church being built as you drive toward Cathedral City? What message about the Grace and Love of God will they share? What are you and I sharing that makes a difference in people's lives?

Last, but not least: last spring we had five women who helped with reading for 3rd graders at our neighboring Elementary School. What a joyful experience for all concerned. Hopefully, we will do this again and will have even more volunteers - female and male. Speak to me if interested and I will see that your name gets passed on.

And last, as we were traipsing around the historic places on the east coast I was thinking: what are you and I, and we as a church, doing to help those who have far less then do we? I believe that we can *continue* to make a difference; do you? Will you?

We were created and born to worship God; Thus:

Sundays continue with worship at 10:00 a.m.

Yes, we had a great time with our grandkids on the east coast, but it is good to be back with you all and to be moving ahead in the "grace that is in Jesus Christ" as Paul wrote to Timothy and as it speaks to us as well.

I am going to keep saying this and hope/pray that you agree:

I am convinced that this church has a great future; that is, I firmly believe God has a great future for us: a resurrection of sorts which is happening.

But you and I have to do our parts! Are you?

How you and I respond will determine the results of God's future for PSPC.

Often when we lose hope and think this is the end, God smiles from above and says, "Relax, Loved Ones, it's just a bend, not the end.





<u>From Donna Den Bleyker's Kitchen</u> <u>Her Mother's recipe for Blueberry Pie</u>

2 pints blueberries
1 cup sugar
4 Tablespoons flour
1/8 teaspoon salt
1 ½ Tablespoons lemon juice
pie crust

Mix berries with sugar, flour, salt, and lemon juice. Pour into pie crust and cover with the top crust. Bake at 450 degrees for 10 minutes, then at 350 degrees for 20-30 minutes longer.

A TASTE OF GRACE

Because Jesus died and rose for us, we have the free gifts of forgiveness and eternal life. That's the meaning of grace: "God's Riches At Christ's Expense," Celebrate God's grace by "spelling it out" with this fun, nutritious recipe.

- What you need:

 An adult to help

 2 bowls

 Mixing spoon

 1 Tablespoon yeast

 1/2 cup warm water

 1 teaspoon honey

 1 1/3 cup flour

 1 teaspoon salt

 Cutting board

 Cookie sheet

- Cookie sheet

 Nat you do:
 Preheat the oven to 325 degrees.
 In a small bowl, stir the yeast with the water and honey. Let the mixture sit for five minutes. In another bowl, stir the flour and salt together.
 After five minutes, add the bubbly yeast mixture to the flour and salt mixture to the flour and salt mixture for the with a spoon and then with your hands. The dough is ready when it's still a little crumbly. Put the dough on a cutting board with a little flour. Knead it into one big ball.
 Divide the dough into 12 pieces, and roll each piece into a snake shape.
 Form the letters G R A C E (twice). Then form the two extra pieces into any shape you choose. For the cookie sheet for about 10 minutes. Let cool, and enjoy!
