

From Lucile Kraehling's Kitchen Cherry Bars

2 C all-purpose flour 2 C quick-cooking oats 1 ¹/₂ C sugar 1 ¹/₄ C butter, softened 1 ¹/₂ - 1 ³/₄ (21 oz) cans cherry pie filling (more of the cherries & less syrup) 1 tsp almond extract ¹/₄ C semisweet chocolate chips ³/₄ tsp shortening

In a mixing bowl, combine flour, oats, sugar and butter until crumbly. Set aside $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups for topping. Press remaining crumb mixture into an ungreased 13-in. x 9-in. x 2-in. baking dish. Bake at 350 for 15-18 minutes or until edges begin to brown.


In a bowl, combine pie filling and extract; carefully spread over crust. Sprinkle with reserved crumb mixture.

Bake 20-25 minutes longer or until edges and topping are lightly browned. In a microwave or heavy saucepan, melt chocolate chips and shortening; stir until smooth. Drizzle over warm bars. Cool completely on a wire rack. Yield: 3 dozen
