Session approved serving in the pews communion beginning November for the winter months instead of intinction.

<u>From PSPC'S Cookbook</u> <u>"Love Feast"</u> <u>Grandma Stephens' Apple Cake</u> From Barbara Stephens

2C flour


½ tsp salt
3 tsp baking soda
3 level T shortening
1 egg, beaten
2/3 C milk
8 to 10 apples, peeled
½ C sugar
1 T cinnamon
Milk or Cool Whip

Sift flour, salt and baking powder. Work in shortening and mix to a light dough with the beaten egg and milk. Spread dough over bottom of a 9 x 1-inch pan. Cover with peeled and quartered apples. Combine sugar and cinnamon. Sprinkle over apples. Bake 30 minutes at 400.
