I noticed today that, for the first time this 'season,' it was cooler inside a building I entered than outside...or, warmer outside than inside, depending on how one looks at it. What this means, of course, is that things are 'heating up' in the desert, just as they are at our little church! With all the goings-one it's hard to keep up sometimes.



The one thing that is not hard to keep track of, though, is the particular joy that we Christians celebrate this time of year, 'Easter.' The Resurrection of our Lord. As culture embraces holy days, they too often become simply a part of the yearly march through the calendar. Christmas always rises to the top as a favorite, with carols, hymns, and, of course, all those presents! Baby Jesus rests in public display surrounded by everything from Hello Kitty to Donald Duck; seriously, I have witnessed this! It is the 'happy holiday,' filled with a good will that crosses theological boundaries, and perhaps some of this is a good thing. However.

Perhaps I get ahead of myself, as we are still on the Lenten walk. But the certain knowledge that Jesus will overcome the Cross makes the path of 'paying attention' and repentance one lined not with thorns, but the petals of a rose.

In this time of contemplation and expectation, be bold in your introspection. Allow your soul to pour itself out through prayer, tears, wondering and wandering. Look at the hills that surround us in a different way, noticing the details of shadow, light and color; stare past the stars that fill the night skies, into the inky blackness that goes on forever. Let yourself feel small in the vastness of creation. Think of the infinite, and think, too, of the finite. Be. Dwell. Breathe.

What is all around us is a love that can't be grasped in a passing thought, or even an hour on a Sunday morning. It is, to use an overly coined word, 'awesome.' A love that defeated death, a reconciling life, an essence that binds all into ONE. What sweet surrender! Easter is coming! Any other day pales compared to this, the greatest gift.

Message Following the Annual Meeting

At our annual meeting on Sunday, February 10th, and without dissent, members affirmed support for Pastor Christine' leadership and our support for Palm

Springs Presbyterian Church. Discussion was short because the annual report had been available and distributed prior to the meeting. It was noted that PSPC has covered remarkable territory in the four years since moving into our "new" home here on Camino Real. The current challenge is to bring Christine's compensation up at least to Presbytery minimum and to wean ourselves from the use of savings (as in the past) to pay part of our monthly mortgage payment. To accomplish those twin objectives, a budget of \$195,000 was approved. This includes a "faith" amount of \$15-\$20,000, which will be raised from various sources, including operational savings, additional gifts from new and current members, activities at our beautiful church, and other sources. A hearty "Thank You" for this support! Now comes delivery!! There is room for all to participate. This article is the first of bi-monthly reports for the Sonshine. Vanishing Oatmeal Raisin Cookies

1/2 C (1 stick) plus 6 T butter, softened
3/4 C firmly packed brown sugar
1/2 C granulated sugar
2 eggs
1 tsp vanilla
1 1/2 C all-purpose flour
1 tsp baking soda
1 tsp ground cinnamon
1/2 tsp salt (optional)
3 C Quaker Oats (quick or old-fashioned, uncooked)
1 C raisins

Heat oven to 350. In a large bowl, beat butter and sugars on medium speed of electric mixer until creamy. Add eggs and vanilla; beat well. Add combines flour, baking soda, cinnamon and salt,; mix well. Add oat and raisins; mix well. Drop dough by rounded tablespoonfuls onto ungreased cookie sheets. Bake 8 to10 minutes or until golden brown. Cool 1 minute on cookie sheets; remove to wire rack. Cool completely. Store tightly covered. Makes 4 dozen.




