Christmas Peppermint Pie

24 Oreos, crushed 1/4 c melted butter

Combine & press evenly and firmly into bottom & sides of a 9" pie pan and chill.

Filling:

Crust:

4 cups miniature marshmallows

1/2 c milk

1 c heavy cream, whipped


1/2 c crushed peppermint candy canes

Melt 3 cups of marshmallows with milk in a double boiler. Mix well until smooth and blended. Chill until slightly thickened. Fold in whipped cream, remaining one cup of marshmallows and crushed candy. Pour into crust and chill until firm. (You may substitute a large 9 oz. cool whip for the whipped cream).
